Take every opportunity to motivate your family to develop good safety habits and practices that will last a lifetime.

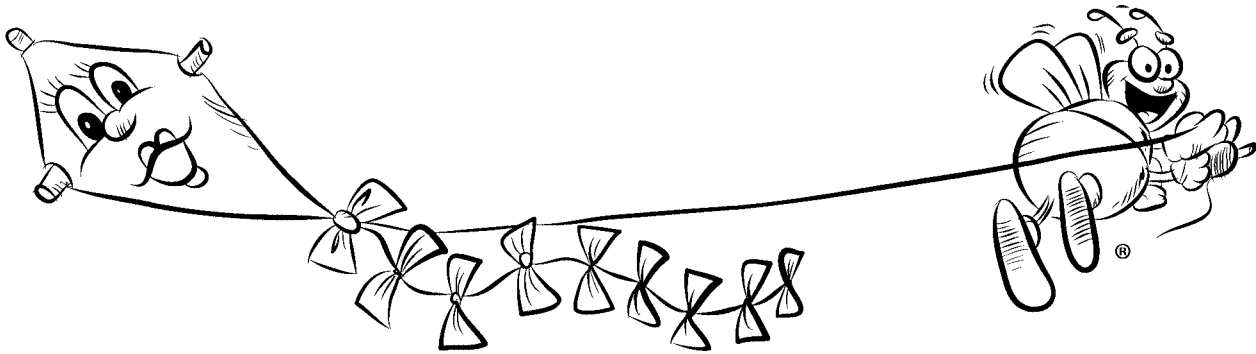

1. Always fly kites, drones or mylar balloons in an open area—never near power lines.
2. Never climb trees near power lines.
3. Keep fingers and other objects away from electrical outlets. Only plugs go there!
4. Never go near downed power lines or substations.
5. Keep ladders and TV antennas away from power lines.
6. Never use blow dryers or any electrical appliance near the bathtub.
7. Stay away from electrical equipment (meters, transformers, etc.).
8. Don't touch anything electrical when you are wet.
9. Stay away from the work area and the truck where linemen are working.
10. Don't swim or play outside on a rainy day. Water and tall things attract lightning.
11. Never pull a plug out by the cord.
12. Obey all safety signs.
